## Chapter 9

## Prohibition Orders and withdrawal of approval

	9.9 The effect of the FCA's decision to withdraw approval
9.9.1	When the FCA's decision to withdraw an approval has become effective, the position of the <i>firm</i> which applied for that approval depends on whether it directly employs the <i>person</i> concerned, or whether the <i>person</i> is employed by one of its contractors.
9.9.2	Section 59(1) is relevant where the <i>firm</i> directly employs the <i>person</i> concerned. Under the provision, a <i>firm</i> ('A') must take reasonable care to ensure that no <i>person</i> performs a <i>controlled function</i> under an <i>arrangement</i> entered into by A in relation to the carrying on by it of a <i>regulated activity</i> , unless the <i>appropriate regulator</i> (as defined in section 59(4) of the <i>Act</i> ) approves the performance by that <i>person</i> of the <i>controlled function</i> to which the approval relates. Therefore, if the <i>firm</i> continues to employ the <i>person</i> concerned to carry out a <i>controlled function</i> , it will be in breach of section 59(1) and the <i>FCA</i> may take enforcement action against it (save where the <i>firm</i> concerned is a <i>PRA-authorised person</i> and the approval concerned falls to be given by the <i>PRA</i> ).
9.9.3	Section 59(2) is relevant where the <i>person</i> is employed by a contractor of the <i>firm</i> . It requires a <i>firm</i> ('A') to take reasonable care to ensure that no <i>person</i> performs a <i>controlled function</i> under an arrangement entered into by a contractor of A in relation to the carrying on by A of a <i>regulated activity</i> , unless the <i>appropriate regulator</i> (as defined in section 59(4) of the <i>Act</i> ) approves the performance by that <i>person</i> of the <i>controlled function</i> to which the approval relates. Therefore, if a contractor of the <i>firm</i> employs the <i>person</i> concerned, and the contractor continues to employ the <i>person</i> to carry out a <i>controlled function</i> , the <i>firm</i> itself will be in breach of section 59(2) unless it has taken reasonable care to ensure that this does not happen. The <i>FCA</i> may take enforcement action against a <i>firm</i> that breaches this requirement (save where the <i>firm</i> concerned is a <i>PRA-authorised person</i> and the approval concerned falls to be given by the <i>PRA</i> ).
9.9.4	<i>Firms</i> should be aware of the potential effect that these provisions may have on their contractual relationships with <i>approved persons</i> employed by them and with contractors engaged by them, and their obligations under those contracts.
