1.1 Overview

- 1.1 This chapter gives an introduction to this guidance.
- G 1.1.1 The Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) is the registering authority for 'registered societies' under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014 (the Act). Registered societies are:
 - (1) co-operative societies;
 - (2) community benefit societies;
 - (3) pre-commencement societies (societies previously known as 'industrial and provident societies'). In this document we refer to all registered societies simply as 'societies'.
- 1.1.2 G This guidance explains:
 - (1) how we approach our role as registering authority;
 - (2) our policy;
 - (3) certain processes under the Act;
 - (4) how we apply society law in our role as registering authority.
- 1.1.3 G This guidance may help people:
 - (1) setting up a society;
 - (2) on the board of a society;
 - (3) advising a society.
- 1.1.4 Members of societies may also find this guidance useful.
