

FSA LOGO LICENCE (AMENDMENT) INSTRUMENT 2008

Powers exercised

- A. The Financial Services Authority makes this instrument in the exercise of the power in section 157(1) (Guidance) of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000.

Commencement

- B. This instrument comes into force as follows:
- (1) Part 1 of the Annex comes into force on 31 October 2008;
 - (2) Part 2 of the Annex comes into force on 1 October 2009.

Amendments to the Handbook

- C. The General Provisions (GEN) are amended in accordance with the Annex to this instrument.

- D. This instrument may be cited as the FSA Logo Licence (Amendment) Instrument 2008.

Permission to use the FSA logo	
3.1	A <u>UK domestic firm</u> , its appointed representatives and tied agents are permitted to use the FSA logo:
	(1) as part of a statement by that <i>person</i> , in a letter or electronic equivalent, that the <i>firm</i> is authorised or that it is <u>and</u> regulated by the FSA, but only in connection with a regulated activity carried on from an establishment in the United Kingdom , or
	(2) if required to do so by the FSA.
<u>3.1A</u>	<u>Until 30 September 2009, any other <i>firm</i> is permitted to use the FSA logo in connection with a regulated activity, other than that of accepting deposits, carried on from an establishment in the United Kingdom.</u>
